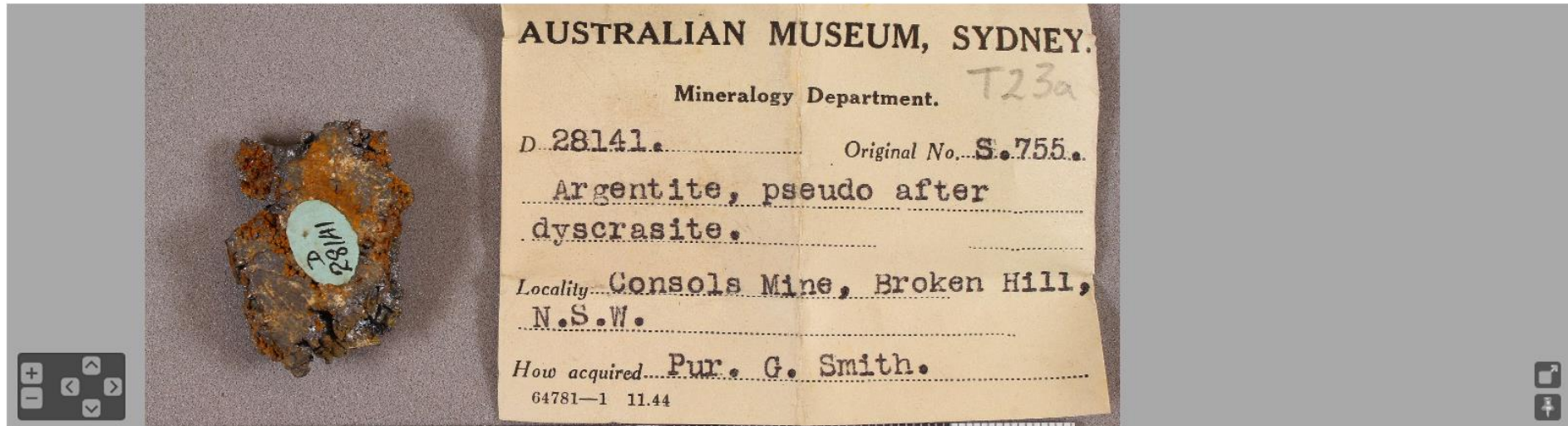

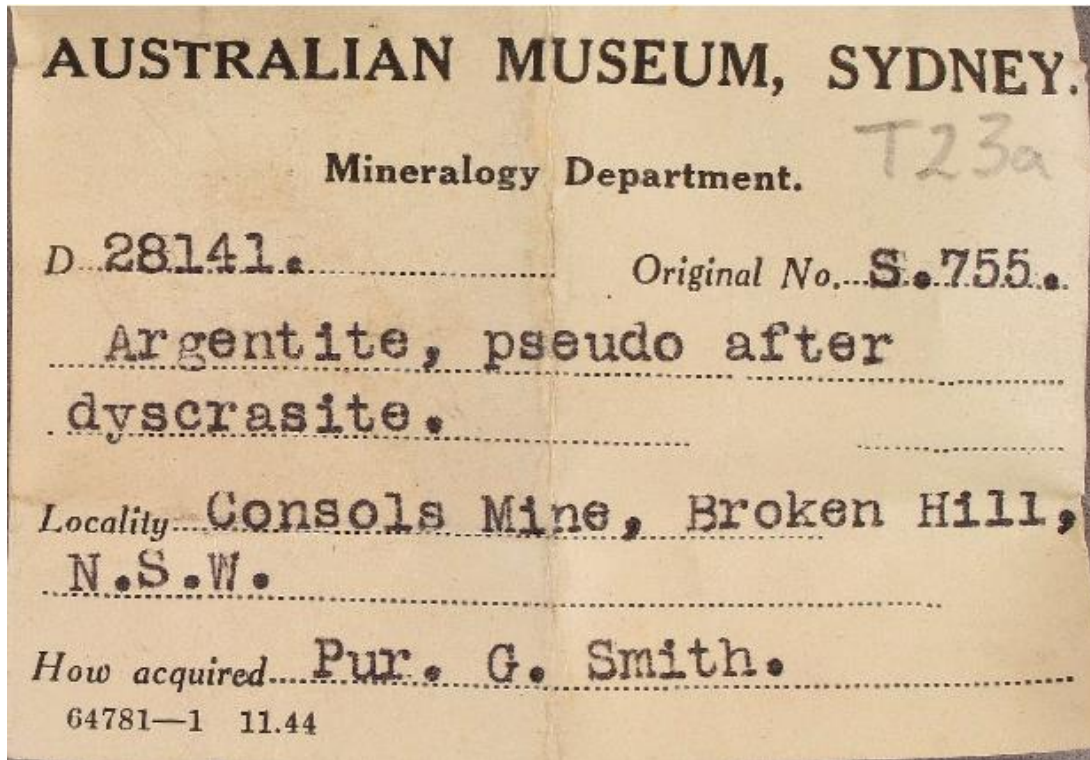

Transcribe All Text

Transcribe exactly what is written in the labels into the Transcribe All Text box. You may omit AUSTRALIAN MUSEUM, SYDNEY and Mineralogy Department. If it has a Duplicate stamp across the label this can be added at the end of the text.

Collection Location

The location should be interpreted from the label. Where latitude and longitude appear on the label, copy the values from the label into the relevant field. If the latitude and longitude do not appear on the labels use the mapping tool. See the [Specimen Label Tutorial](#) for more information on locations and using the mapping tool.

Miscellaneous

Species: Enter in this box the main mineral species on the label. For the above example that would be Argentite.

Species description: Add the species description here. There may not be a description on the label so this field can be left blank.

Original No.: Enter the number that appears in the label next to 'Original Label'. This may be a number without a prefix or a S or M number.

Other numbers: Any additional numbers other than the D number or original number. This number can appear anywhere on the label or specimen and includes T numbers.

How acquired: How the museum acquired this specimen. Examples to add to this field would be donation, exchanged, fall, mined, purchased or transferred. O.C. which means 'Old Collection' can also be added to this field.

Person's name: The person or groups name will be written next to how the specimen was acquired. Use a new line for each individual person.
